- We gave six area food banks a total of 518 items, which included stuffed animals, scarves/hats/mittens and a few toys.
- 144 quilts went to Children's Hospital, Child Haven, Washington State Soldiers Home, Veterans Hospital, Compass House, and Quota International.
- 228 medical dolls to Children's Hospital.
- 194 baby hats to Valley Medical Center, Children's Hospital, and Pediatric Interim Clinic. The hats were made by Kathy Lyons and Yoshi Akers and Jean Derheim.
- 75 lap protectors to Washington State Soldiers Home, and Renton Rehabilitation.
- 12 afghans to Renton Rehabilitation. The afghans were made by Estelle Mead.

We had the raffle drawing of the Seahawk quilt at our Christmas potluck and the winning ticket holder was Jean Derheim. Thank you everyone for the great support in buying a ticket, the total sold was \$194 and it will be used to buy more supplies to make more quilts, etc.
