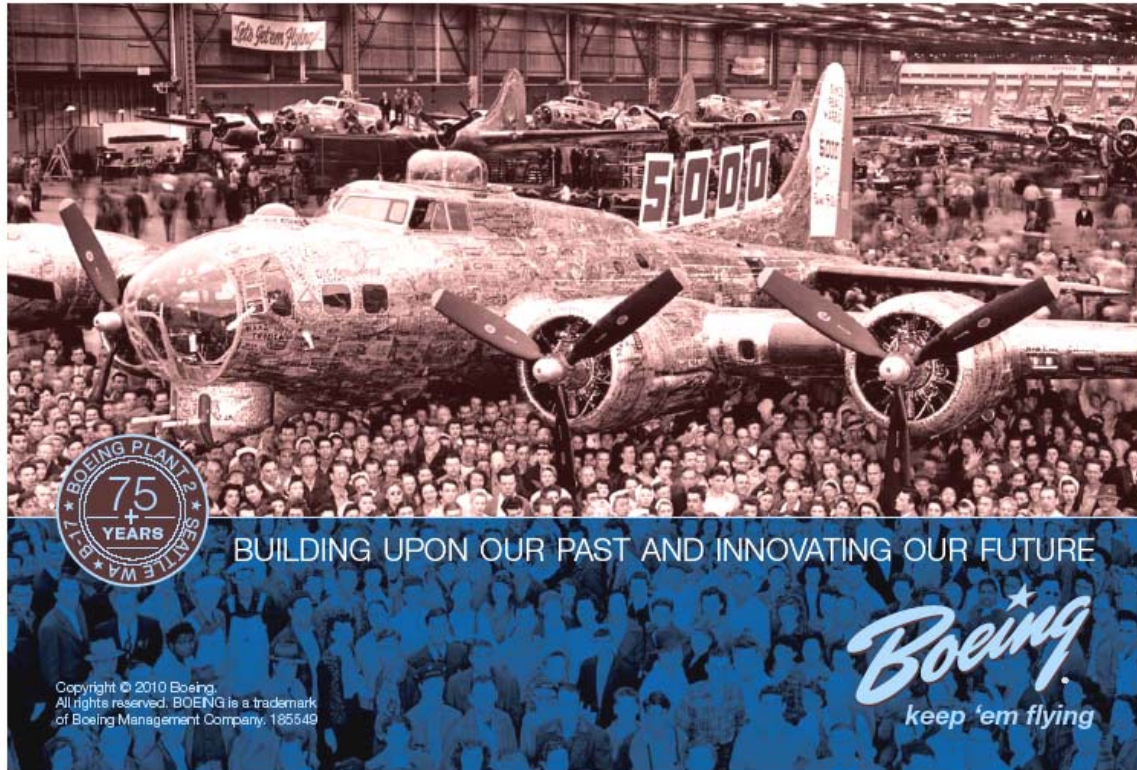

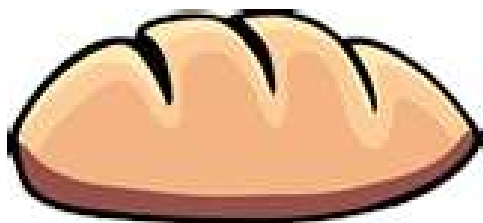

Mentoring Children of Promise works with children who have an incarcerated parent, connecting the children to caring, stable adult mentors who can be a positive role model in their lives. Joell Coltrane, of the Volunteers of America, will talk about the program and the wonderful kids who are waiting to be matched with mentors. The focus at this time is on finding male mentors because there are 16 boys currently waiting for a mentor in Snohomish County.

Put the MEN back in Mentoring! The unfortunate truth about mentoring programs is that often times boys wait much longer than girls for a mentor of their own. Over 82% of the youth on our wait list are boys. Volunteers of America Western Washington's Mentoring Children of Promise program strives to make the best adult/child matches possible by taking into consideration the personalities, activities, and interests of our mentors and youth with the intention of creating a long-lasting friendship. All it takes is 8 hours per month of your time, doing activities you love!
