It is time to submit your Bluebills volunteer hours for the month of June or any previous month. If you have hours that have not been reported, you may submit those also. Thanks for your input.


CLC Report

One large box of yarn was donated and delivered to the Meadows Housing (seniors) for the Flying Fingers group.

Three large boxes of yarn were delivered to the Boeing Quilting Group. The Boeing Quilting Group meets the second Saturday of the month at the Activity Center. They had invited me for a visit as they were curious about the Sew N Sew Group. They have a group of about 20 and their yearly dues are \$20. They do volunteer quilting two months out of the year and then the rest of the time do guilts of beauty and show. It's a great place to go and see the beautiful quilts and to learn more about quilting. The group is comprised of all regular Boeing employees and the sewing day is their day for themselves. It has been a busy month at The Flying Heritage Collection. On June 13, 14, and 15 they hosted the Collings Foundation's B-17 & B-24 during which they sold flights. On June 14th the FW-190 and the P-51 were Fly Day stars flown by Steve Hinton and his son with about 2,000 guests. On June 20th the CAF flew their B-29 into Paine field and on June 21st and 22nd sold rides. It will be at HFF for a couple of weeks and will sell rides during the 4th of July weekend.

On July 26 will be FHC's 1st SKYFAIR and it will be an all day affair starting at 10:00 AM. A tank and flak gun demonstration will be held in the morning, and flying starts around noon. The aircraft being flown that day are: FHC's B-25, BF-109E, IL-2, Zero, and P-40, HFF's F7F Tigercat and F8F Bearcat. Greg Anders is bringing his AD-4 Skyraider and Planes of Fame are bringing their P-38 and Corsair. FHC is expecting 6,000 guests that day and is still seeking volunteers to aid in many ways.
