## Chairman's Report

A warm welcome to our new members, John Tam in March and Lynn Weber in April. Both have already helped out: John, by inputting the various lists of members, friends and associated volunteer organizations into Excel so the newsletter can be distributed both via regular and email; and Lynn, by volunteering to train members in using those lists to distribute the newsletters. This is needed because our long-time member, Alan Gale, who normally would handle those duties, is facing serious surgery, and he will be busy recovering from that.

John, a long-time Boeing employee is now busy volunteering at the City of Lake Stevens Food Bank. He heard about our organization from John McAlpine, of the RSVP. John sent me the email included elsewhere in this newsletter. Our deepest sympathy regarding the loss of your daughter. Thank you for sharing the story of this horrific accident.

Lynn described his history with Boeing and also told us his volunteering activities. He also is eager to join us in the various upcoming events.

Attendance at our meeting has been steadily declining over the years, for a variety of reasons, even with efforts to recruit new members. I recently received a call from Merv Shetler, a retired VP and long-time chairman of the Central Leadership Committee. He asked me to set up a meeting with the three active Bluebills chapters: the Olympic, Sno-King and Heritage, and the Central Leadership Committee at the Boeing Activity Center in Snohomish County to discuss what actions can be taken to recruit new members. This meeting is scheduled to take place in May.

At our April meeting, we talked about how to use a defibrillator (and where to find one if needed). I'm hoping to find someone experienced in its operation to do some training. (Yes, I am motivated by a recent personal experience.)

At our May meeting, we discussed the news of two of our long-time members: Weston Nielsen and Alan Gale. Weston fell and was taken to the hospital where it was discovered he had a severe incident of bleeding in his brain. It was determined there was nothing to be done, so he was sent home to die, according to his wife, Jean. Alan is facing extensive surgery because his cancer has recurred. We are sending our hopes and prayers to both men.

This is open to those who like to sew, knit or crochet. Ouilts and other items such as hats, scarves and afghans are all donated to a variety of agencies in the local area for the low income and homeless. FYI, items for boys/men are needed. Try to use darker colors, and sport themes are popular. Too many girl items are being donated and the agencies are overstocked.

**UPCOMING ACTIVITY** as soon as it gets a little warmer -- clean up the flower gardens near the old Everett train station. Wear garden clothes, bring gloves and small equipment. A lot is done on Sunday afternoons. Stay as long as you can.
