## VOLUNTEERS NEEDED AT PORT TOWNSEND HOMELESS SHELTER



You are all aware of the homeless problem in America and Port Townsend is no exception. For the last two years a group of concerned citizens have organized a means to provide a homeless shelter at the Port Townsend American Legion Post #26. The shelter is open from November into March. This service has been made possible with the cooperation and support of OLYCAP, several local churches, and many willing volunteers. Olympic Area Community Action Program (OLYCAP) is the primary sponsor of the program in partnership with Community Outreach and Shelter Team (COAST) serving as facilitators/coordinators.

Clients arrive at 4:00PM, have a warm meal, sleep the night, have breakfast and leave at 8:00AM the following day. The shelter has been providing a warm and safe haven for 15 to 20 people seven days a week since Thanksgiving. It is interesting to note that one in three of the clients are homeless veterans.

Local volunteers prepare and deliver meals and also provide people to monitor the 'guests' during 100% of the time the shelter door is open. Volunteers work in two shifts; from 4:00PM until 11:00PM and from 11:00PM until 8:00AM each day. These good folks even kept the shelter open all day Christmas and New Years day so the people would have a place to spend the holidays.

It takes many volunteers to keep this service going seven days a week for several months. Volunteers are needed.




Will you email it if asked? Yes.

What motivates you?


Fear of failure and having fun.




Favorite Shoes?
