



Davis Steelquist and myself finished this railing project last week spending a total of 34 hours (including driving time). The cost to the client was \$361. We will go back in a few weeks and finish coating the handrail when the weather is a little warmer (above 55 degrees). As there was only the two of us that showed up, it took two days to finish the work.

This particular job started in October of 2007 when the clilent requested a new ramp to replace the one that was built many years before with a step in the middle of it that required her to stop short of the porch and unload her walker basket,

move the walker up on her porch, refill the basket and take it the rest of the way into her house.

At that time it was noted that she traveled up a long path from the street that had no railing and we asked if she would like us to put a railing in for her. As she had



been using that path for 67 vears since she had first moved in. she felt that would be unnecessary for now. The long spell that we had in icy December and January trapped her in the house on the hill for several weeks, nearly letting her run out of medications. Additionally, the original railing next to the ramp was starting to rot away and leaving the little railing she had worthless. She asked for the railing to be repaired but there wasn't enough left to work with and thus a new one was needed. She decided

that maybe was now the time to do the whole 70 feet down to her garage and the street. We still need to go back and place a finish coat on the hand rail once the weather gets up above 55 degrees.

Larry Noedel and Dan Nordmark worked on the ramp in 2007, and Davis Steelquist and Dan provided the railing in 2009.



We have just received \$2700 funding to do some improvements to a house on the Coyle peninsula.

*The money came from OlyCap (\$700) and REPAH (\$2000). Catholic Community Services is acting as our agent.* 

This will be in the nature of a repeat of the house we did in Port Hadlock.

The home needs kitchen and bath heating and insulation and interior finish, new counter and sink in kitchen (there is none). Exterior we need to seal windows and install siding and enclose the crawl space.

We have been trying to get funding for this project since 2007 and the time just seemed right, I guess.

Hope to start in early March.




