

In the past couple of years he has acted as our Social Chairman, organizing the quarterly get-togethers that we hold.


From a Bluebills viewpoint, our loss could be another chapter's gain so we hope Howard finds a chapter on the Seattle side who can use his skills.






32 volunteers contributed 676 hours in September.

This makes 6,705 for the year to date vs. 6,487 this time last year.


**From Jack Hawker**

## **BLUEBILLS ELECTRONICS RECYCLING**




Our second annual Electronics Recycling Day took place at the Port Ludlow Recycling Area on Sept 20. It surprised me that we actually took in more electronic equipment than we did in our 2006 collection, 4,535 pounds vs. 4,400 pounds. Where does it all come from? We would have had a couple hundred pounds more but we had to turn away three early birds who we just weren't ready for. Bob and Arlene Burns had a good idea when they initiated electronics recycling in Port Ludlow. It prevents a lot of toxic materials from potentially polluting our environment.



We again had some light rain this year, But not nearly as wet or cold as in 2006. Our kept the canopy cashiers their and records dry, and the coffee and Danishes supplied by some of the volunteers were most welcome. The heaviest single item was a TV at 128 lb., not nearly as impressive as last years 182 lb. TV.

Skookum received \$1,587, which at \$.35/pound, is what they pay the Seattle firm that segregates all the materials for their ultimate recycling. And as fundraisers, the Community Enrichment Alliance and the Port Ludlow Village Council each received \$145.

## DISTRIBUTION OF SCHOOL SUPPLIES COMPLETED

Delivery of school supplies and items from the Gifts-In-Kind program has been completed.

It's difficult to describe the amount of goods we provided to the thirteen schools who are eligible for these goods but it would average out to about a pickup truck load for each school.

We distributed nearly 200 new backpacks among other things. The backpacks were provided by World Vision. Many of them purchased with funds donated by Boeing Employees. About 100 of these backpacks were filled with school supplies that are typically used by elementary grades. Most of the supplies were purchased by Bluebills and community members in Port Ludlow and Brinnon. Each backpack has items worth \$15-\$20.


