

Bluebills build ramps out of wood, but if someone offers to donate one of the metal ones we'll take it. This one originated in Poulsbo, but it was 2x too steep so we built the client a new one. The metal one was moved to Bainbridge Island where it was quickly set up for a client who couldn't be released from rehab without a ramp in place. Unfortunately it was only used briefly before the client passed away. The ramp is now at its third home, this time in Bremerton.




The metal ramp and platform fit nicely. John White, Michael Crovitz, Richard Knapp, and Bob Keever served on the crew.

The process included interacting with the client, performing site survey and design, procuring the materials, and constructing the ramp. The client previously parked her walker on the deck, precariously shuffled down rickety stair steps with a loose railing, then grabbed a second walker that she kept at the bottom of the steps. It was an accident waiting to happen. She is much safer with her new ramp, and John and Michael proved that they can swim.








#### **Builders Status**
