


Bluebills support for the Dove House is on-going. We try to schedule monthly deliveries of their requests for supplies. So, as you do







Last year the Port Townsend Food Bank began opening

on Saturdays to serve those 65 and older. This is a demographic with an increased risk of falling and perhaps with limited income. We want to do what we can to reduce the risk of falling by

offering free grab bars and railings to anyone in this group. Bluebills provided this program in November last year and we will be offering it again in April of this year.

Real Estate Professionals for Affordable Housing (REPAH)

has again provided \$300 for grab bars. Hadlock Building Supply has donated handrail material and brackets.

The actual installations are handled by our Builders.

Northwest Harvest, Washington State's hunger relief agency states that Washington is the 15th hungriest state in the nation and in the top 6 where hunger is growing fastest. One in four kids in Washington state lives in a household that struggles to put food on the table. To address this issue, the Bluebills have partnered with the Peace Lutheran Fellowship Backpack for Kids Program, the Chimacum Food Bank, and the YMCA Summer Feeding Program. And the new backpack programs in Port Townsend and Quilcene. There will be a lot of activities and opportunities to volunteer in the coming months.
