2017 has been another incredibly busy year for the Bluebills. Judy McCay reports that through October, 107 Bluebills reported 13,562 volunteer hours in various programs serving the community. These volunteer hours were filled with the monthly rotation of the World Vision Programs in Clallam, Jefferson, and Kitsap Counties, and the adoption of the first grade class at Chimacum Elementary by volunteers in the classrooms.

2017, Bluebill accomplishments include:

- Raised money to buy 32 Chrome Books for Chimacum Elementary.
- Worked with the YMCA Summer Nutrition and Literacy Program.
- Ran the 6th Annual Dove House Tournament raising \$17,630.
- Entered the Jefferson County Fair where the Bluebill booth again captured 1st Place.
- The ongoing installation of ramps and grab bars all contributed to our care of the community.



New Glasses for Chimacum First Grader



In response to this request, Bluebill members stepped up and donated \$385 to purchase the new pair of glasses. 

New Style of Grab Bar for Brinnon





Recently Bluebill George Sickel installed a new kind of grab bar for a couple in Brinnon. The "Curve" grab bar can swing in 180 degrees and lock in 45 degree increments. The client will use it to transfer from his wheel chair to his lift chair and back. We had not seen this type of grab bar before, it looks very useful. Nice work George!

Kudos to CG too. We had JUST enough 2x2s and six 2.5" screws left out of a bucket of 450. Total people hours 158.

It came out really nice and the client (who currently drives a lot for ECCHO) should be able to stay in her home and bring her groceries and friends in safely. 


