Chairman's Corner

As we tend to do, this month our management group would like to enlighten you with a few words about one of the partner 501c3 organizations where our ties of support is especially appreciated. This is the Jefferson County Dove House Advocacy Services Organization, more commonly known by us as DV/SA. My message isn't about our Christmas support, nor is it about the transfer of love between the CEA, the Bluebills, and DV/SA. It is about DV/SA as an organization providing legal advocacy, counseling, medical advocacy, crime victim advocacy, therapy, safety planning, school based prevention groups, education assistance, a crisis line, information and referrals, and—as we know—emergency shelter. As such Dove House is the Jefferson County's sole provider of free services to families of victims of sexual violence and general crime. Since December 2009 when they moved to their new location next to the hospital in Port Townsend, they have served 188 new clients providing services and housing as necessary. Residents may occupy transitional housing for up to two years as they work on obtaining stable employment and housing.

Since 1983, then known as the Domestic Violence Sexual Assault Program, they have been supporting the disadvantaged in Jefferson County and later, working closely with Healthy Families and the YMCA of Kitsap County to ensure that all victims on the peninsula have access to these critical services. I am pleased to introduce this group.
