- Have a Clallum County Appreciation event that is tailored to their specific activities and a Quilcene/Brinnon Appreciation Day with the same agenda.
- Ask Program coordinators to nominate a volunteer of the month.

Follow up with New Members:

- Ask recruiting Bluebill to follow up with new volunteer to insure they connect with a program
- Get list of new member interest to Program Coordinators for follow up
