2016 REPORT

We did a lot of work in 2016 but things slipped a bit from 2015.

<u>Membership:</u> We gained 12 new members in 2016. Still, our membership went down from 212 to 186. This is mainly due to people moving. In addition we had some old names that should have been removed before. David Goudie does a good job trying to keep our membership list current, but if you move or change email addresses, you have to let him know at <u>oldsilverback@q.com.</u>

<u>Volunteer Hours Reported:</u> Our hours went down from 15414 in 2015 to about 13000 for 2016, approximately a 15% decrease. One reason is that outside of Builders and the World Vision program, demands for our services seemed to decrease in 2016. There is no longer a Tri-Area food bank truck to unload each month and requests from Dove House are fewer and there is no longer a need for period drives to collect items for them. The situation is similar with our support for the Homeless.

<u>Members Participating (Reporting Hours:</u> In 2016, 107 members reported doing some volunteer work vs 114 in 2015. This meant that almost half of our members were not able to find some Bluebill activity that they could help with or that they wanted to work on.

To all of you, I like this quote from Teddy Roosevelt:: "It's not the critic that counts...the credit belongs to the person who is actually in the arena, whose face is marred by dust and sweat and blood, who strives valiantly, who errs again and comes up short again and again...who spends himself on a worthy cause and who, at best, knows the triumph of achievement, and at worst, fails while trying. **Happy New Year, Myron.**

Preventing Falls

It's always good when we can implement fall prevention fixes before an accident happens. Bluebills received a request via Catholic Community Services to put in step railings for a client in Suquamish. Railings were installed in 3 locations and some bad treads replaced as well. A stairway leading down to the garage looked particularly ominous with it's lack of railings, damaged tread, and cement blocks at the bottom of a pit (see before and after photos).

North Kitsap Fire & Rescue collaborated with the Bluebills and provided all of the materials for this project using a special fund that's supported primarily with donations from their member's paychecks. Their public information officer stated that "We're excited to be partnering on this effort and look forward to additional opportunities in the future."

BUILDERS DATA

Here is the data for 2016. Pretty much what we do in this area every year. But, stop to think about it a bit...

Fifty-five ramps. We put in so many of these in cases where you wonder how the family coped without the ramp.

On hundred and fifty grab bars and fifty-five railings. Lots of these were put in after the client had already fallen a few times.

We helped families in one hundred-ninety five different households live better and safer. We're not some large organization supported by fund drives and publicity. Every time we run into a client who cannot afford to pay for the material needed, we have to work to find a way to cover the cost. Thanks to organizations such as Jefferson County Real Estate Professionals for Affordable Housing (REPAH), Port Townsend Elks and Legions Clubs and various other organizations, funding can almost always be found. Thanks to all of you who help with this.

Special thanks to our partners at Catholic Community Services, Donna Jones (Jefferson and Kitsap Counties) and Teri Wensits (Clallam County), who provide us with insurance coverage for these jobs.



Builders Data

Our last ramp was built for a 6 year old who was born with a disability. He was finally able to maneuver with a wheelchair but couldn't get into the house. When we did this ramp, his mother was in tears knowing her son could be home for Christmas and be mobile. Material for the job was paid for by Real Estate Professionals for Affordable Housing. (REPAH).
