

United Good Neighbors of Jefferson County (UGN)

This month the Bluebill Spotlight is on United Good Neighbor of Jefferson County. Bob Peden is the UGN Director. He is a Boeing Retiree and one of the founding members of Olympic Peninsula Bluebills. Bob has helped over the past ten years with his advice and acting as an advocate for our goals.

UGN From the first year of raising \$5,000 (5 programs) in 1957 to 2005 when UGN raised \$320,000 (over 30 programs) the long range operating philosophy has remained the same "Support those programs that meet a valid community need in the county. In our long range planning in 2004 we added a mission feature that accented a "Safety Net" approach to allocated funding where we give priority to those programs that not only meet the needs of the residents but are most basic and vital needs such as the food bank and the free health clinic as well as emergency housing. In the 2008/2009 fiscal year we help fund 42 programs operating in the county and which provide a much needed health and human service to all residents of Jefferson County. The major categories of service are Basic Needs, Youth and Senior Activities, Community Outreach and Specialized Counseling. UGN does belong to The United Ways of Washington.

The Bluebills have established two programs that UGN helps support. One is the bicycle repair program and the other is the Gifts In Kind program... Both of these programs are funded by UGN through Catholic Community services as part of their normal operations because they also cover the volunteer insurance labiality for the Bluebill workers and provide some of the cycle spare parts funding. The Blubills are not a 501 (c) 3, tax exempt organization. Their volunteer support has grown significantly in the last 10 years. Their reputation in the County is excellent and UGN is proud of its support to them.

GIFTS-IN-KIND PROGRAM



Each month we distribute about 8 or 9 pallets of goods to the various agencies, churches and schools who are members of the GIK program. Hardly ever do any of the Bluebill volunteers actually see the recipients of these goods. Each month the GIK members send thank-you letters to the companies who provide the goods. These all come through our organization and they are hand-carried to World Vision in Kent for distribution to the donors.

You should be aware that the GIK members we serve know full well, that although the goods come from companies via World Vision, Boeing Bluebills are the group that actually deliver the products to their doorstep. So, quite often among the company thank-you letters there are extra thank-you notes to Bluebills. Here are a couple of excerpts from this month. .

This is a hand-written letter from a woman who received some clothes from Dress Barn.



My name is (deleted) and I am one of the recipients of the beautiful clothes your group has provided to Catholic Community Services. I have recently become single with two children, no money and no job skills. I am currently receiving on-the-job training and studying for my G.E.D. These clothes will be of great benefit to me as I go our into the community on job interviews and subsequently to work. Knowing I am dressed appropriately will greatly boost my confidence.

I am writing to thank you for your great generosity in helping me and other women in my situation to dress appropriately for the marketplace.

Note: we distribute about 40 boxes of new clothes from Dress Barn each month. Another sample from Family Planning of Clallam County:

Family Planning teams with Swedish Breast Cancer's traveling Mammogram Coach to provide mammograms to rural, medically-underserved, low-income women in their own communities. This month the donated products were used to fill up colorful "gift bags" to give to women after they have completed their exams and mammograms. We see happy smiles on their faces and hear appreciative comments as they look in their "gift bags" and find shampoo, conditioner, hair-gel, hand lotion and body wash.

The Boeing Bluebills organization is a valuable team member that helps provide quality health care for the women of the Olympic Peninsula.
