2008 BLUEBILL GIFT GIVING TO PENINSULA DV/SA AGENCIES

Many Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Agency clients from Kitsap, Jefferson, and Callam Countys will be able to celebrate Christmas with nice gifts this year, Our Annual Christmas Social was another great success.

Monetary donations were received from quests at the Social and from Community Enrichment Alliance. Much of the money collected (\$5,000) was from Community Enrichment Alliance. Members of CEA have worked for months so that they could contribute to our Christmas Gift Giving Program. CEA contributed \$5,000 and other Bluebill quests contributed \$1,087, to make a total of \$6,087 to purchase gifts.

The money was shared to buy gifts for 73 DV/SA clients and to buy Safeway Gift Cards for each of the 31 families. Folks who volunteered to shop received \$70 for each individual client and a \$30 Safeway Gift Card for each recipient family.

In addition to gifts purchased from commercial outlets, World Vision donated many boxes of ladies and teenagers clothing to be added to our program.

Many thanks to CEA, our individual contributors and all of you folks that worked so diligentloy to make our Christmas Giving Program a big success again this year.

BLUEBILLS YEAR-END AWARD GOES TO LEE AMUNDSON




Lee Amundson received our year-end award for his Gifts-In-Kind volunteer work.

QUILCENE COMMUNITY PROJECT ON SCHEDULE

SEQUIM BAMP REQUIRES A BIG BLUEBILL TEAM

We recently built a replacement ramp for a couple in Sequim. The job was complicated by the fact that the door was 46 inches about the ground.

Our specification calls for one foot of ramp for each inch above the ground, i.e. a 46 foot ramp. A further problem was that there was limited space

to install a 46 foot ramp. Plus there was already an old ramp that was too steep and had to be removed.

Larry Elton coordinates a lot of the jobs in Sequim and Port Angeles and he came up with a plan. The job was referred to us by Catholic Community Services and they provided us with insurance coverage.

Because we had to remove the old ramp and do a lot of rework to the existing porch this job took us a couple of days and about 100 man-hours.

Helping were Ken Winter, Bill Shain, Mike Mallett, Ed Hughes, Gifford Asher, Marv Segar, Mike Graham, Myron Vogt, Dan Holtz, Larry Elton and Jack Hawker.

Ken Mellott (bad backcouldn't work) showed up and took the pictures.

The existing ramp was too steep for the user to get up and difficult to get down. The slope on this is about 4/1 (four inches of "run" for every inch of "rise"). The building code and Bluebill specification call for a minimum of 12/1. The old ramp was removed during the rebuild.

This year we did something different. We ually do not make a GIK delivery in December because we do the Christmas Giving for families in the Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault programs. However, World Vision was moving in December and happened to have available a large number f Hanna Montana clothes for young girls, toys and school supplies and a number of other items at seemed appropriate to distribute to our GIK members. We picked up enough goods to distribute: Sixty Shopping bags full of toys and school supplies About 2000 articles Hanna Montana clothing **Over 1080** women's tee shirts 180 plaid jumpers for girls 60 boxes of women's clothes from **Dress Barn**

We also distributed about 15 bikes that were received from the Port Townsend Police department and reconditioned by George Ansley
