Get out your golf clubs and join us in Port Ludlow on the afternoon of July 17.

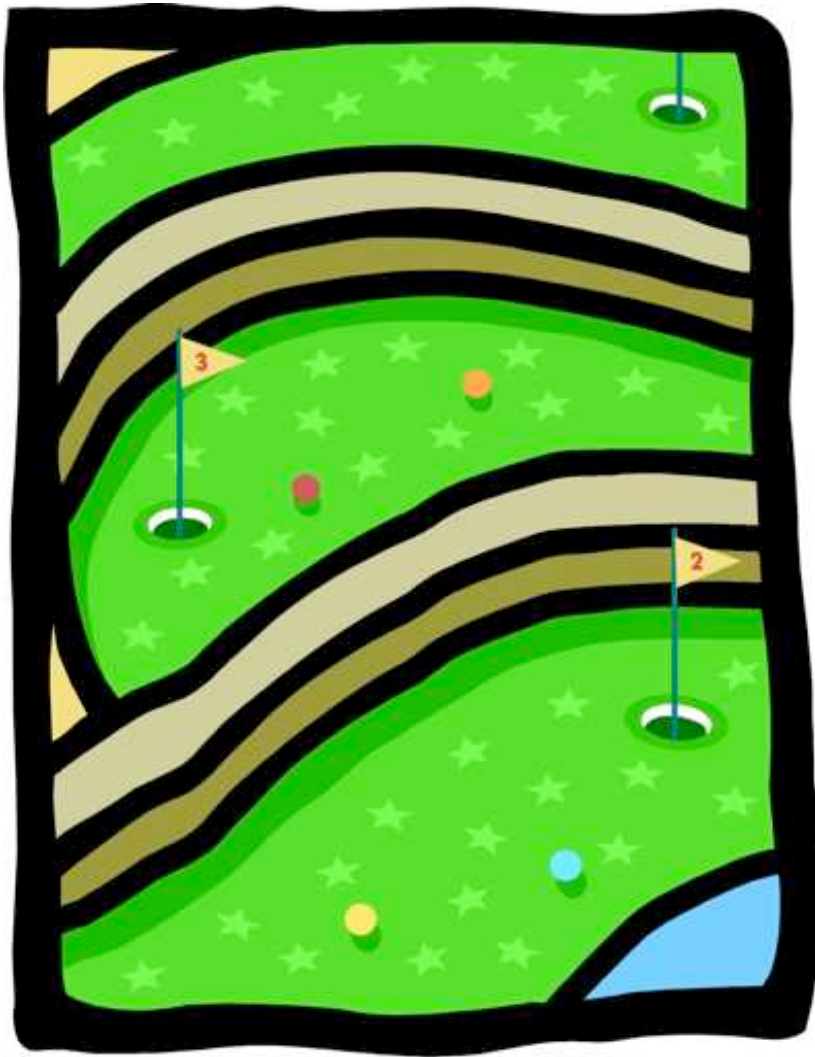
We will have nine holes of player-friendly golf starting at 1:00.

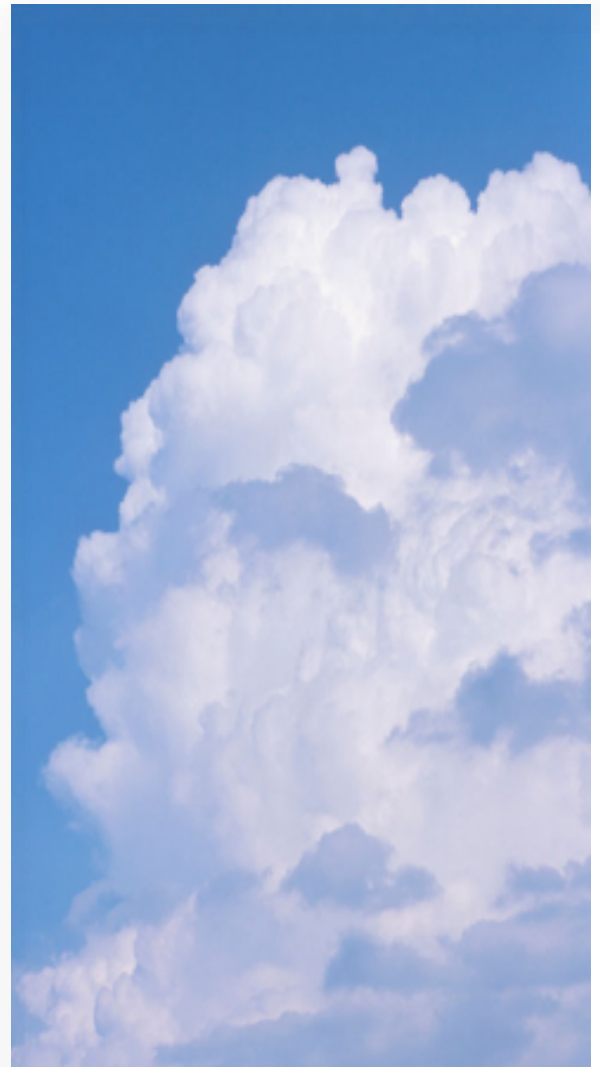
