HELPING OUT IN SEQUIM

A family in Sequim needed help getting a wheelchair-bound person from the house to the driveway. Jack Hawker designed and organized the team that built the ramp shown in the pictures.

Our ramps are pretty standard, however some are build with handrails; some, like this case, have only guard rails. Handrails are designed to be grasped and used in walking up the ramp. Guard rails are intended to keep a wheelchair from running off the ramp.

We add handrails if the building code calls for them or if we know the client will be walking up and down the ramp and can use something to hold onto. If the ramp is to be used only for a wheelchair we do not install handrails. Handrails are costly and the price of the material is always a consideration.

PORT LUDLOW COUPLE WIN PLAYHOUSE

On September 28 Community Enrichment Alliance (CEA) selected the winner of the playhouse built Bluebills several months earlier. From the 580 tickets sold, Linda Colasurdo of the Bay Club pulled out one of the tickets purchased by Luanna Cooke of Port Ludlow.

The Cookes have 13 grandchildren in the Seattle area and the playhouse will end up at one of their homes.

Bluebills partnered with CEA early this year in planning and constructing the playhouse.



Material was furnished by Hadlock Building Supply in Port Hadlock. The playhouse has been on display almost every weekend at locations from Brinnon to Sequim and spots in between. CEA members staffed a table selling raffle tickets at each location.

The net proceeds exceeded \$2800 all of which will go to CEA's Chimacum High School Scholarship fund.





BLUEBILLS DELIVER MORE GOODS TO SCHOOLS THAN EVER

Again this year we did our distribution of school supplies to those schools we serve who have more them 70% of their students on free or reduced price meals.

Under the leadership of Dick Ostlund we have been collecting school supplies in a 40 X 12 foot warehouse since July. It was completely full when we were ready to make the deliveries in late September. Each school received a full pickup load of school supplies plus anything they wanted from out Gift-In-Kind warehouse. In total. We delivered about 20 pallets of goods to 13 schools covering an area from Shelton, near Olympia, to Queets, Neah Bay and Clallam Bay, on the west coast of Washington.



To accomplish this our members:

- -Drove over 4000 miles picking up and delivering goods.
- -Worked 370 hours picking up, sorting, inventorying, loading, unloading and delivering these goods.
- -This was done by 23 Bluebills and other community members who could see the value of helping with this program.

We looked the job over and were able to build him a forty foot ramp that provided access to his workshop. The point is that our neighbors also need to be able to live a life that is more then sitting in front of the television and one of our goals is to help them do this.



This ramp leads from the driveway to the garage entrance, providing the client with access to his workshop. For those who care, you can notice the jog in the ramp which was needed because of second floor overhang didn't provide enough headroom to run the ramp straight down the side of the house.
